


#### Long-Term Real GDP Growth Trend

Percent Change 20-Year Quarterly Moving Average





#### **Real GDP Growth**


#### Quarterly and Annualized Real GDP 1990-2017


#### National Employment

Month-over-Month Change, 12-Month Average





#### **Labor Force Participation Rate**



National by Age Cohort




#### Labor Force and Unemployment Rate

National by Educational Attainment, Population 25 and Over, 2016








#### State Employment Growth



Total by Age Cohort, 1970-2050





Percentage of Population






#### **Employment Change**




Region 9 and Archuleta County, 1971-2016


Region 9, 1971-2016


Region 9 and Archuleta County, 1970-2050


Total by Age Cohort, 1990-2050



Share by Age Cohort, 1990-2050






Indexed Growth, 1969-2015


#### **Employment Comparison**

#### **Region 9 Covered Employment**


12 Month Rolling Average

#### Region 9 Covered Wages


Annual (4Q Rolling)

#### Region 9 Average Wages


Annual Rate (4Q)

Region 9, as of Q4 2016




### **Nonmetro County Population**


Average Population Growth, 1990-2014

Average Annual Growth, 1990–2014








## **Employment Growth and Assets**


## **Nonmetro County Employment Growth**

Average Annual Growth, 1990–2014






### Employment and Prime Working Age Population


### **Share of Value Added**

Colorado Total Employment Growth and Agriculture




### **Share of Value Added**





# Observations & Economic Resiliency Guide

- Vision Your Community:
  - Create a development plan with buy-in and input from the community.
  - Think creatively and be authentic to your community's personality when creating a vision for your community.
- Invest in Community Assets:
  - Identify community assets ideal for community placemaking.
- Seize Opportunities and Take Risks:
  - Develop and foster a culture of commitment, seizing opportunities, building businesses and community assets and diversifying your community's industries.
  - Take risks and invest in your community and businesses.





# Observations & Economic Resiliency Guide cont'd

- Invest in Education and Healthcare
  - Consider education and healthcare as a tool for family and labor retention and attraction and invest accordingly.
- Infill/Density and Annexation Options
  - Inventory annexation options and evaluate infill and annexation policies.
- Collaborate and Work Regionally
  - Pool resources and build capacity by working regionally.
- Empower and Engender Leaders
  - Champion current leaders, making them ambassadors for your community.
  - Develop young professional leadership programs to encourage and support the next generation of leaders.
